

# 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 NLT

<sup>16</sup> Always be joyful. <sup>17</sup> Never stop praying. <sup>18</sup> Be thankful in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you who belong to Christ Jesus.



Prayer starts as a discipline. As we understand more about prayer and God, and as we build a relationship with Him; prayer moves away from being a discipline into something we desire.

## **Daniel 6:10-11 NLT**

<sup>10</sup> But when Daniel learned that the law had been signed, he went home and knelt down as usual in his upstairs room, with its windows open toward Jerusalem. He prayed three times a day, just as he had always done, giving thanks to his God.

Daniel had already established the priority of prayer in his life so even when the threat of persecution came, he continued as he always had.

## **Luke 11:1-2 NLT**

<sup>1</sup> Once Jesus was in a certain place praying. As he finished, one of his disciples came to him and said, "Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples."

<sup>2</sup> Jesus said, "This is how you should pray.."

We can put so much guilt on ourselves because we think we should just magically know how to pray. However, the disciples didn't know either, so they asked, being willing to learn.
